Nash Health Care Systems operates the hospitals known as Nash General Hospital, Nash Day Hospital, Coastal Plain Hospital and the Bryant T. Aldridge Rehabilitation Center.

Nash General Hospital is a 280-bed acute care facility that began admitting patients in 1971. It was the first all-private-room hospital in North Carolina. In 1993, Nash General opened a 23,500 square foot Emergency Care Center. In 1998, a new intensive care unit was opened.

Nash Day Hospital was opened in 1984 as North Carolina's first freestanding day hospital offering treatment and surgery on an outpatient basis. Nash Day Hospital added two additional operating rooms in 2000 and a second new MRI scanner in 2001. These improvements increased capacity and reduced wait times as well as expanded the range of services offered. Nash Day Hospital's services include a full range of outpatient surgery options, endoscopy, laboratory, radiology, radiation oncology, rehabilitation, cardiopulmonary rehabilitation and the Rocky Mount Heartburn Treatment Center which is located at the Nash Urgent Care facility.

Coastal Plain Hospital, acquired in 1993, is a 50-bed psychiatric and substance abuse facility opened in 1991, and offers comprehensive adult inpatient treatment services to residents of central and eastern North Carolina. Services available include medical detoxification, substance abuse rehabilitation, and acute psychiatric stabilization for both voluntary and involuntary patients.

The Bryant T. Aldridge Rehabilitation Center, a 23-bed facility, opened in 1999 offering comprehensive inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation services for patients with brain trauma, stroke, degenerative disease, spinal injury, patients who have undergone joint replacement, and more. Its state-of-the-art facilities and atmosphere pave the road to recovery for residents throughout Eastern North Carolina.

Nash Health Care Systems is a North Carolina hospital authority organized by Nash County, North Carolina and controlled by a fourteen (14) member Board of Commissioners who are appointed by the Nash County Commissioners. Each serves three-year terms.

Nash Health Care Systems primarily services a six-county area including Nash, Edgecombe, Franklin, Wilson, Warren and Halifax counties, but draws patients from well beyond these areas as well.
