Lucas Martinez, M.D.

Dr. Martinez, a board-certified neurosurgeon, completed his medical studies at the Universidad Complutense in Madrid, Spain and his internship at Bridgeport Hospital in Bridgeport, CT. He completed his general surgery residency requirements at Albert Einstein Medical Center in Philadelphia and his neurological surgery residency at Hahnemann Medical College and Hospital, also in Philadelphia. After residency, Dr. Martinez joined the faculty of Thomas Jefferson University Hospital in Philadelphia, where he was an instructor and assistant professor for four and a half years. In 1980, Dr. Martinez joined the staff of Nash General Hospital. He was the first neurosurgeon to practice in Nash, Edgecombe and Halifax counties.

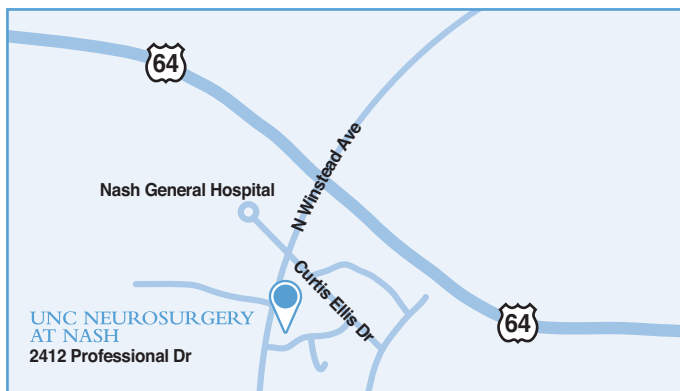
